Commencement Information

To Our Guests

Commencement, the solemn but joyful climax and recognition of the graduates' years of study, is an important occasion to the University, its faculty, staff, and students. All guests and participants are requested to avoid unnecessary conversation or moving about during the exercises.

When the processional party enters at the beginning of the ceremony, the audience rises. They remain standing until all members of the platform party have taken their places on the platform.

Following the chancellor's closing remarks, there is a recessional. The audience is requested to remain at their seats during this period.

We welcome you to the fifty-third annual commencement exercises for associate and baccalaureate degree candidates at Penn State Hazleton.

Academic Procession

The medallion worn by Chancellor Elizabeth J. Wright during the ceremony was instituted by the University in 1971. Symbolizing the authority to confer degrees, the bronze medallion is two and three quarters inches in diameter with the

founding date of the University on one side and the founding date of the Hazleton campus on the other side.

The mace carried by the Faculty Marshall is inscribed to honor the memory of Marlene Guers who served the campus for nearly thirty years in a range of positions including senior instructor in mathematics, coordinator of the honors program, and assistant director of Academic Affairs.

In academic commencement ceremonies, the mace is the symbolic extension of the chancellor. Most often carried in a commencement ceremony at the head of the marchers or immediately ahead of the chancellor, the mace serves as the object vested with the power of the institution.

Academic Dress

Academic regalia originated in medieval monasteries to distinguish persons such as doctors, masters, and bachelors from the general population. In about 1895, American colleges and universities adopted the uniform code of academic dress that is used today.

Caps

The traditional cap in the United States for all degrees is a black mortar board. The tassel is usually black, but the doctor's cap may have a gold tassel.

Gowns

The design of the traditional academic black gown signifies the degree held. The bachelor's gown has pointed sleeves, while the master's gown has oblong sleeves that are open at the wrists. The doctor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves with three velvet chevrons.

Hoods

Hoods are usually not worn by recipients of the bachelor's degree. The master's hood is three-and-a-half feet long and the doctor's hood is four feet long. The linings of the hoods are in official colors of the university conferring the degree. The velvet hood trim indicates the subject of the degree. Some colors associated with the disciplines include: arts, letter, and humanities – white; business – drab; economics – copper; education – light blue; engineering – orange; fine arts – brown; journalism – crimson; music – pink; speech – silver; philosophy – dark blue; physical education – sage green; science – golden yellow; and social work – citron.

Cords

An honor cord provides an outward sign that these particular students have excelled in the classroom or have served or are serving our nation with pride.

Academic honor cords recognize the top 12 percent of degree candidates in each college and at every campus. Students who are graduating Summa Cum Laude are wearing a blue and white cord, students who are graduating Magna Cum Laude are wearing a blue cord, and students who are graduating Cum Laude are wearing a white cord.

Adult students excelling in the classroom while facing competing interests of home and work are recognized with membership into Alpha Sigma Lambda honor society. Members of Alpha Sigma Lambda are wearing a burgundy and gold cord.

Students who have honorably served, are serving, or are commissioned to serve in the U.S. military will be awarded an honor cord in recognition of their duty and sacrifice. The red, white and blue

cords will be given to eligible graduating students in the following groups: active duty, reserve and National Guard service members; veterans; and graduates receiving a commission through Reserve Officers' Training Corps (ROTC) and official U.S. Armed Forces recruiting programs.

Jennifer Malaga currently serves as a student success coach in the Student Success Center at Penn State Hazleton, where she provides students with critical academic resources and support.



Born in Peru, Malaga moved to the United States in 2007 when she was 16 years old. After graduating from Hazleton Area High School in 2009, she enrolled at Penn State Hazleton with the goal of earning an art degree.

Malaga's educational journey hit a snag in 2011 when she had to take an unexpected leave of absence. However, behind the encouragement of Penn State Hazleton faculty, she remained dedicated to the pursuit of her degree during this time and returned to campus.

After transitioning to the University Park campus, Malaga switched her career focus from art design to photography. That decision inspired her to spend her spring 2014 semester studying abroad at Studio Arts College International in Florence, Italy. She graduated in summer 2014 with a bachelor of arts degree in photography and a minor in Spanish.

Eager to start her career, Malaga launched Jennifer Malaga Photography soon after graduating, where she specializes in portraits. Her passion for photography soon took her to Florida, where she accepted a studio photographer position with Dean Stewart Photography. That role saw Malaga photograph high school students for their yearbooks, graduations and other significant events.

Her next role was as a photographer for Colorvision International at Universal Studios theme park in Orlando. Malaga photographed guests with theme characters throughout the park. She rose to the position of assistant manager in April 2018 where she oversaw numerous associates at several different store locations.

Wanting to be closer to her family, Malaga returned to Hazleton in late 2018. She volunteered for the Downtown Hazleton Alliance for Progress and worked as an administrative assistant for Sam-Son Productions.

At the same time, Malaga helped her parents as they began a commercial and residential cleaning business, Malaga's Cleaning Company. The family sought out the entrepreneurial resources and guidance of the campus-affiliated Hazleton LaunchBox supported by Pasco L. Schiavo Esq. to build a sustainable business and viable path to growth while Malaga worked in various administrative roles with her parent's business.

Since accepting her position at Penn State Hazleton, Malaga has utilized her bilingual skills, career journey and experiences as a Penn State student to guide current students towards academic success.
